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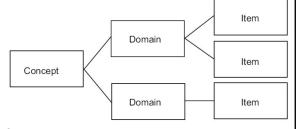
The Need vs The Challenges

- The Need
 - Instruments (surveys) to capture patient reported measures of symptom status, functional status, and health related quality of life (at a minimum)
- The Challenges
 - Long surveys, administer/score/integrate in care
 - Multimorbid patients
 - Impact on patient & provider relationship (WHY)



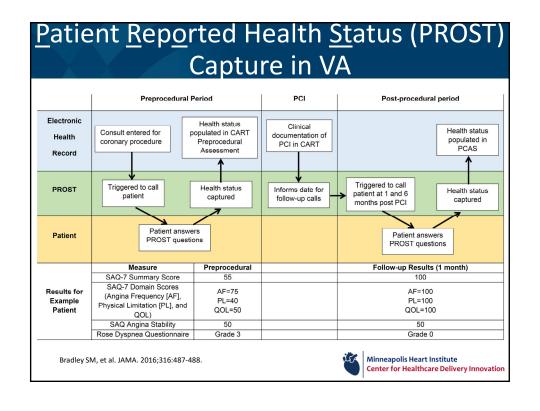
Addressing the Challenge of Administration and Integration

- Moving from long to shorter instruments
- Self-administered (phone, app)
- Summary score



- Are properties of the instrument intact?
- Do the results vary on method?
- What is the summary?





Addressing the Challenge of Multimorbidity

- Coronary artery disease: 3 surveys (14 items)
- Multimorbidity the norm
 - 10 chronic conditions
 - Each with important PROs
- Burden?
- · Disease specific vs global

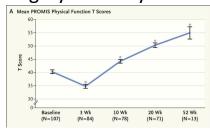




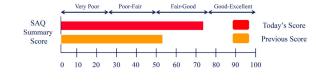
